
Acknowledgement of Country

We are also thrilled to be offering a new venue partnership with The Hub at Blue Mountains Theatre in Springwood. This follows our seasons at cherished old favourites – Bella Vista Farm and Leura Everglades, the sites of so many rich experiences over the years.

In March/April we have an extraordinary **Jove Main Stage** offering – **Shakespeare and Marlowe's History Cycle: The Player**

Kings – a company of some of Australia's most revered performers including John Gaden, Peter Carroll, Katrina Retallick, Leilani Loau, Sean O'Shea, Marty Alix, Steve Rodgers, Emma Palmer, Andrew Cutcliffe, Gareth Davies, Lucinda Howes, Ruby Henaway and more tackle Shakespeare's epic history of the "Hollow Crown" from Richard II through Henry IV and Henry V, to the "Wars of the Roses", the masterful study of political chaos that is Henry VI and Richard III. Don't miss it. This is a short and remarkable season, get in quick, tickets are limited. Huge thanks to Seymour Centre for being our associate partner in this special event.



Next up, we partner for the first time with Hayes Theatre for the brilliant Steve Martin & Edie Brickell bluegrass musical, **Bright Star** – electric atmosphere, joyous rhythm and profound humanity. And we close the year out with Peter Shaffer's intense, frightening and utterly brilliant **Equus**, playing in the Shed Theatre at Bella Vista Farm, an incredible and immersive site-specific event directed by Margaret Thanos, whose 5-Star **I Hate People**; or **Timon of Athens** was one of 2024's best shows of the year, and in a hugely exciting piece of news, **Timon** is back in 2025, playing a strictly limited return season in the York Theatre at Seymour Centre in June. 



THE TEMPEST / HAG-SEED SYMPOSIUM

BY WILLIAM SHAKESPEARE

One of Shakespeare's truly original and most personal plays, *The Tempest*, is a symphonic vision of forgiveness, discovery and self-discovery. Famous for its language, context, enchanting characters and breathtaking theatricality, the play is a reflection of the world's most famous playwright at the height of his powers and at the end of his remarkable career.

This tempest is not only in Prospero – the storm lies in the contradictions and ambiguities the story throws up about freedom and slavery, civilisation and barbarism, legacy and letting go, lust and chastity, youth and age, revenge and forgiveness. The sea is a place of transformation but also represents the capriciousness of nature, chaos, or fate.

Sport for Jove will unpick the play with students through live performance and analysis, and direct contrast and comparison with Margaret Atwood's *Hag-Seed* in this unmissable performance symposium.

THE CRUCIBLE SYMPOSIUM

BY ARTHUR MILLER

The Crucible, Arthur Miller's parable of mass hysteria, is a portrait of the ordinary evils latent in any society, of mindless, hysterical persecution through ignorance, fear of 'otherness', and our capacity to serve ourselves above all others, making it one of the world's most transcendent and important stories, in any age.

Damien Ryan's intensive and detailed performance symposium on the play offers a rich opportunity for students to meet the characters, look beneath the play – at its language, characters, form, and theatricality – and discuss the big ideas with professional actors who have a long relationship with the play.

What does it mean to us now? Come and join the conversation. After all, we can stand back from these puritanical thinkers and feel safe from their ignorant, outdated superstitions and prejudices, but Miller's very successful point is that we just can't. The belief systems and modes of persecution might change, but the ignorance and willingness to hurt each other do not.

The Crucible illustrates these things at personal, familial, judicial, and political levels, and asks actors to give everything they have to tell it.

Having first encountered this play myself as a student and having studied and taught it in varying contexts over 30 years, I came away with new thoughts and further considerations... I'm not sure if students quite understood just how fortunate they were to encounter your symposium, but they were.




